## Minutes of the Greater Kingston Civic Association April 17, 2024 General Membership Meeting St. Michael's Lutheran Church, 7-9pm

After a brief welcome & an association business segment, the GKCA executive committee gave the floor to Cherry Hill Mayor Dave Fleisher to address the attendees. Mayor Fleisher introduced officials & staff present. He informed the audience about his administration's efforts to increase communication on many fronts:

• An improved website & new app (myCherryHill)

• The Mayor's weekly message every Thursday & sharing of Cherry Hill notices through civic associations. Mayor Fleisher highlighted successful & ongoing community development projects & priorities, such as:

- The resumption of July 4th fireworks in Cherry Hill beginning this year
- The stopped development of a Wawa gas station at Barclay Farm Shopping Center
- The purchase of Holly Ravine Farm for open space & of the Kingston Estates Swim Club for a future park
- The Rt. 70 resurfacing, PSE&G upgrades & cooperative road maintenance in neighborhoods
- \$10M in scheduled roads upgrades, including 20 roads in Greater Kingston
- A strong new tree ordinance
- Efforts to minimize & mitigate flooding & drainage problems for those most affected.

A brief Q&A on these topics followed, including:

- NJAW-patched roads that were previously newly paved will be redone curb-to-curb
- Storm sewer grates are smaller for bicycle safety (a State requirement) & the Department of Public Works maintains a hot list of clogged grates that require maintenance
- Sewer back-ups experienced by some residents
- Very bumpy roads (pot holes) in places will be repaired/asphalted after the current concrete work is completed (towards the end of summer)
- Insufficient lighting in some areas of the neighborhood
- Traffic mess at Rt. 70 exit (a dedicated right turn lane may be added)
- Traffic speeds, increased enforcement & CHPD stats
- Traffic hazards resulting from cars parked on both sides of the street, especially along bus routes, & by PSE&G heavy machinery parked on streets, not the swim club lot
- Flood victims wrote their names on a list provided by GKCA at the sign-in table. Mayor Fleisher said his administration would meet with these residents separately to address their issues.

At 7:51pm, Mayor Fleisher pivoted to the park presentation. The park is projected to be a \$3.5M-\$4M investment. A committee of interested residents met with the Mayor's office twice to offer neighborhood input on the project. This presentation reflected results of those two meetings:

- The Gene Hart hockey court will be relocated onto KESC grounds
- A ½ sized basketball court will be moved forward, towards Deland Rd.
- All buildings will be demolished & park facilities will be geared toward all ages
- Several graphic concept plans were projected for the audience to see
- The public made comments about various features but generally approved of the concept plans.
